Ammana has only very recently joined the team but hope to have something more about her in the next issue







He came to the Friendship Café as a young person at the youth club and put himself forward as someone who could help repair and maintain bikes when he was about 13 years old, something that he did as a volunteer. He always wanted to ride but there was a big waiting list so after waiting his opportunity came up last year at the city farm and he has been learning and volunteering at the same time. He mucks out stables, helps the instructors, welcomes the little children, fills the haynets and is working towards his 'Riding Centre Assistant Award'.

He has also been offered a fully sponsored week placement at the British Racing School in Newmarket in August this year. As well as meeting HRH The Princess Royal, who we have inside info to say that she found him the most interesting volunteer that day, he also gave four interviews to various media outlets including the BBC and ITV that morning.



Opportunity to work at The Friendship Café as an Outdoor Learning Officer.

We are looking for an Outdoor Learning Officer.

What is Outdoor Learning? Well, it's when the Great Outdoors is the office instead of a desk and a screen, and the natural environment such as the countryside and the natural world is the classroom.

The Officer's job will be to arrange groups to get involved and participate in activities making the most of the countryside that is so close to us such as the Forest of Dean and Robinswood Hill and all the other beautiful sites that many people (especially people of colour) in the inner-city areas often take advantage of. The post will be a half time (18.5 hours) post initially funded generously by the Ernest Cook Trust for a period of 3 years but we hope that it becomes a permanent post in the long term.
